BACKGROUND

The division of Technical Vocational Education and Training Development in the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology (MoEST) in Tanzania is prioritising improving the alignment of education provision and labour market needs. As part of a part of a range of actions taken by the MoEST and the Vocational Education and Training Authority (VETA), MoEST is looking to build capacity to better to support the analysis of labour market information and the use of that analysis in improving VET provision in Tanzania.

IDENTIFIED NEED

The request for support focused on two key requirements: capacity building for VETA and Ministry Staff to improve the interpretation and understanding of the effective use of labour market analysis; and, allied to this, the design and piloting of a sector planning tool, in a priority sector, to support a range of improvements in meeting sector and employer needs.

ACTIVITIES

The intervention focussed on helping to strengthen the strategic development of evidence-based planning in TVET in Tanzania. It provided key staff in country with the knowledge, skills and a tracer study handbook to utilise labour market intelligence more effectively to shape training provision in the critical sector of tourism.

LESSONS LEARNED

LMA, if carefully developed and applied, has a key role to play in the development of Tanzanian TVET programmes that can improve the quality of labour productivity, grow Tanzania industry and the capacity of TVET graduates to develop their own businesses and help to build an enabling and inclusive environment for all Tanzanians.

There are a number of national and developmental initiatives which need to be better harmonised to capture a shared view of skills priorities, including this planning tool.

The use of LMA is not strategically applied in Tanzania and there can be long gaps between studies. There is a need for training for key agencies and there are also budgetary challenges associated with resourcing regular LMA.
